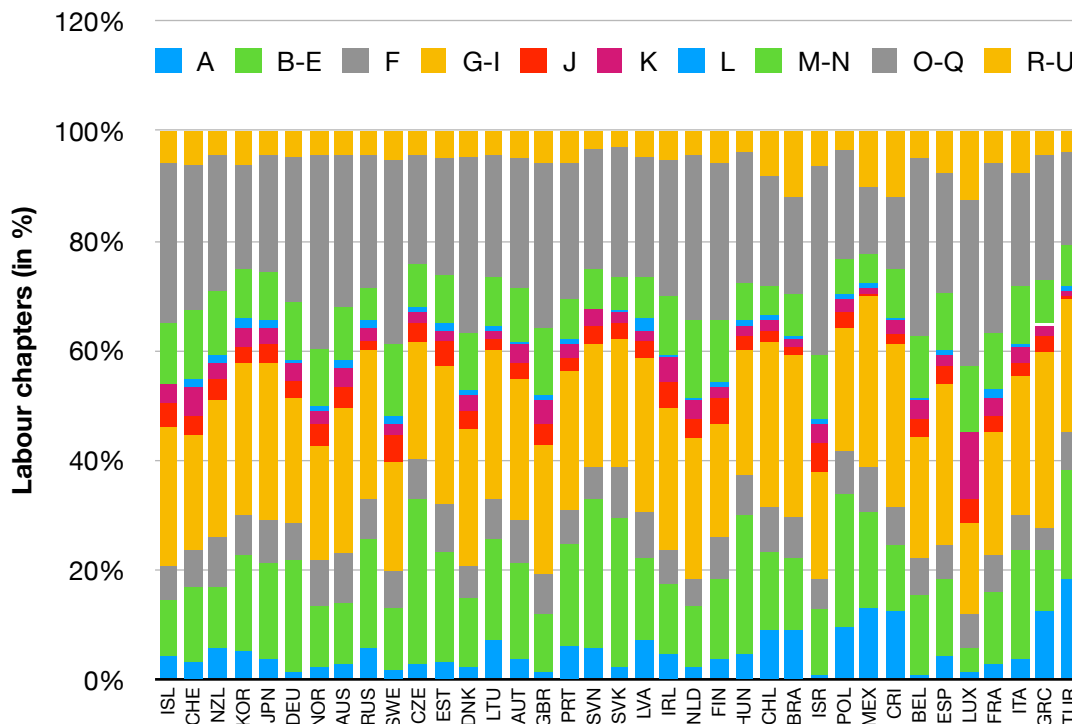


# How is the labour structure in countries?

## Labour structure

The graph below shows the proportion (in %) of each labour chapter in countries ordered by employment rate. Chapters G-I and O-Q are contributing the most in general, especially in the countries with highest employment.

**A: Agriculture, hunting and forestry**

- B: Mining and quarrying
- C: Manufacturing
- D: Electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply
- E: Water supply, sewerage, waste management and remediation activities

**F: Construction**

- G: Wholesale and retail trade, repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles
- H: Transportation and storage
- I: Accommodation and food service activities

**J: Information and communication**

- K: Financial and insurance activities

**L: Real estate activities**

- M: Professional, scientific and technical activities
- N: Administrative and support service activities

**O: Public administration and defence, compulsory social security**

**P: Education**

**Q: Human health and social work activities**

- R: Arts, entertainment and recreation
- S: Other service activities
- T: Activities of households as employers undifferentiated goods- and services-producing activities of households for own use
- U: Activities of extraterritorial organisations and bodies
